**AN ORDINANCE DECLARING CERTAIN
VILLAGE EQUIPMENT AS SURPLUS AND
APPROVE FOR DISPOSAL**

WHEREAS, is has been determined according to the state statues and Village ordinance by the corporate authorities of the Village of Vernon Hills that there exists certain surplus equipment; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities desire to dispose of such surplus equipment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF VERNON HILLS, COUNTY OF LAKE AND STATE OF ILLINOIS:

The following items to be disposed of through a waste removal vendor:

Miscellaneous furniture that is damaged, considered excess, and no longer of value.

Miscellaneous equipment (non-computer) that is either damaged, considered excess, or no longer of value. Example of items are broken microwave ovens.

Construction material. From the rehab of the American Family Insurance facility to the Communications Center. This is material that is excess, and no longer of value or no longer serviceable and of no value.

Miscellaneous - items such as broken athletic equipment / broken fishing poles from Village-oriented community policing projects. This is equipment that is damaged, considered excess, or no longer of value.

Section II: The said surplus equipment will be donated or disposed of in a proper manner.

Section III. SEVERABILITY. In the event that any section, clause, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be found and determined to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid parts shall remain in full force and effect. If any part of this ordinance is found to be invalid in any one or more of its severable applications, all-valid applications shall remain in effect.

Section IV. REPEAL AND SAVINGS CLAUSE. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall affect any rights, actions or causes of action which shall have accrued to the Village of Vernon Hills prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

Section V. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law, dated this day of June 17, 2014.


Section VI. ORDINANCE NUMBER. This ordinance shall be known, as Ordinance Number 2014-023.
